Spring: A Great Time to Review Your Safety Checklist

With spring comes a feeling of renewal. Families everywhere begin cleaning out their basements and garages. Windows are opened, flowers bloom and the days grow longer thanks in part to Daylight Saving Time, which this year began on March 12, 2017. When you set your clocks forward, the National Safety Council reminds you also to review a safety checklist for your home.

1. Smoke Alarms

Smoke alarms save lives but only if they are powered by a fresh battery. You should test them every month to make sure they work and replace the battery at least once a year. If you hear the alarm make a "chirping" sound, replace it immediately. Smoke alarms should be every bedroom and in the common areas on each floor of a

home. Mount them at least 10 feet from the stove to reduce false alarms, less than 12 inches from the ceiling and away from windows, doors and ducts.

2. Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Carbon Monoxide(CO) is an invisible, odorless gas, and it can kill you. Anything in the home that burns fuel can potentially become a source of carbon monoxide.

Carbon Monoxide alarms should be installed in a central location outside each bedroom and on every level of the home. The best way to keep these detectors working properly is the same way you take care of your smoke detectors ... change the batteries, test them and interconnect them, if possible. Also, make sure vents for your gas appliances (fireplace, dryer, stove and furnace) are always keep an eye on the outside vent to keep them clear of snow or debris.

3. Family Emergency Plan

Every family should have an emergency plan in place in the event of a natural disaster or other catastrophic event. Spring is a great time to review that plan with family members to make sure they know what to do. Take a day when you are all home, and practice your run. Don't forget your animals too! A communications plan to outline how your family members will contact one another if they are not in the same place.

Have a neighbor's tree as a meeting place if it's safe to go outside.

4. What Else Should You Do This Spring?

Clean out your expired medicines and take them to a prescription drop box. There is a Prescription Drop-Off box in the Robesonia Borough Office.

SPRING CLEAN-UP

2017 Spring Clean-Up will be held on Friday, May 5th and Saturday, May 6th from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Mark these dates on your calendars since we only have one clean up a year! Due to the rising disposal costs of Spring Clean-Up, the Borough Council of Robesonia has declared the following:

- ◆ All materials to be disposed of **must be delivered** to the Borough Garage located at 210 S. Elm St. by the individual.
- ◆ Confirmation of residency (identification) must be provided.
- ◆ Following is a list of charges for disposal:
 - ❖ Mattresses, boxsprings \$40.00
 - ❖ Stuffed Furniture (ea. Pc) \$10.00
 - ❖ Major appliances \$20.00
 - ❖ Refrigerators/ Freezers \$35.00
 - ❖ Air Conditioners \$10.00
- ◆ **NO Tires – NO Toxic Waste**
- ◆ All fees will be collected at the Borough Garage and are payable with cash, check or money order only.
- ◆ The Borough has the right to reject any excessive quantity of disposable material.

NOTICE: When purchasing tires, insist that your dealer dispose of the replaced ones. No toxic waste, such as oil-based paint, etc. will be accepted. If you have any questions, please call the Borough Office at (610) 693-3474.

REMINDER: Effective January 24, 2013, The Pennsylvania Covered Device Recycling Act requires that all consumers not dispose of covered devices, such as computers, laptops, monitors, televisions, etc, with their trash. Trash haulers are no longer able to take these devices. The Borough will no longer be able to accept these devices at Spring Clean-up. In order to dispose of electronics, tires, hazardous waste, etc., please contact the Berks County Solid Waste Authority at 610-478-6362 to find out dates/times you can drop off those items.

The Pennsylvania primary this year is Tuesday, May 16 and the general election is Tuesday, November 7.

2017 PRIMARY DEADLINES

Pennsylvania has a closed primary meaning a voter can only vote for his/her registered party

- Last day to register for the primary election is April 17
- Last day to apply for an absentee ballot for the primary is May 9
- Last day to submit (civilian) absentee ballot for the primary is May 12

2017 GENERAL ELECTION DEADLINES

- Last day to register to vote for the general election is October 10
- Last day to apply for an absentee ballot for the general election is October 31
- Last day to submit (civilian) absentee ballot for the general election is November 3

Voter registration applications are available at the Borough Hall. With this application you may:

- Register to vote
- Change your party affiliation
- Change your name/address

MISSHAPEN STREET TREES

Have you noticed how unnatural the trees appear along Penn Avenue? Unfortunately PP&L overhead utility line maintenance and PennDOT's ongoing US422 reconstruction are the causes of the unusual shapes. PennDOT required a fourteen (14) foot clearance along the curb line for shifting traffic during the roadwork. Hence the vertical cuts on the traffic side of the tree line. All of the trimming work was conducted by certified arborists, with the assurance that the trees were trimmed in accordance with established industry standards. New growth is already reestablishing and the trees are attempting to regain their normal crown structure. Any idea of how many shade trees are growing throughout Borough between curb and sidewalk, also known as the "tree lawn"? A recent inventory undertaken by Seth Ravert and his local Scout Troop for his Boy Scout Eagle project revealed a total of 289 shade trees. That's good news, BUT during the last inventory conducted in 1990 there were 418 trees.

The Shade Tree Commission is looking for property owners willing to have a tree planted in the "tree lawn". There is no cost, and studies have shown that trees increase property values. Call 610-693-6387 if you are interested in having a tree planted this spring. Someone from the Shade Tree Commission will contact you and provide a list of the approved trees. The approved trees have small leaves and do not attain a height that will interfere with overhead lines.

Robesonia will be recognized as a "Tree City USA" for the 27th consecutive year by the National Arbor Day Foundation on April 28th. The last Friday in April is recognized as the official Arbor Day in Pennsylvania and it will be celebrated by the Borough during a program starting at 9:30AM along East Penn Avenue, slightly east of the intersection with Linden Street. A tree will be planted, the Arbor Day proclamation will be ready by Mayor Randall Gartner, and a Forester with the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) will speak about urban forestry. Selected Robesonia resident 6th grade science class students from the Conrad Weiser Middle School will also participate in the tree planting.
